IMPORTANT UPDATE REGARDING YOUR WASTE MATERIALS

Dear City Resident,

We have important updates to share regarding waste and recycling practices at your residence:

- **As of April 1, 2022, residents can place food waste in the Green “Organics” Bin(s) and should not place food waste in Trash Bin(s);** and,
- **Bulky item pick-ups must be scheduled by Property Management.** Leaving bulky items on the curb, street, or on the premises without arranging for proper disposal with Property Management is considered illegal dumping.

These citywide changes are a result of new laws passed in the City of Glendale (Glendale Municipal Code 8.56.160), which were established in order to comply with State law (SB 1383, AB 341, AB 1826).

On the property, there are bins for:

- **Organics:** food scraps, food-soiled paper products, plant trimmings, yard waste, and clean, untreated wood waste (no paint, no stain, etc.). Food Waste should be placed in clear bags.
- **Recycling:** flattened cardboard, clean paper, clean glass bottles and jars, clean plastic bottles and containers, beverage and food cartons, cans, clean aluminum foil.
- **Trash:** Items that are not organic waste and not recyclable.

Importantly, the following items are considered hazardous waste and must be disposed of at a Hazardous Waste facility below:

- Glendale Environmental Management Center Free disposal of all batteries (including car batteries), cleaning products and disinfectants, paint, fluorescent lamps and tubes, automobile fluids (antifreeze, lubricating fluids, motor oil, and filters), paint and solvents, prescription medication, and over-the-counter medication, pesticides, fertilizers, and more.
- Glendale Recycling Center Free disposal of batteries (except car batteries), cell phones, computers, radios, tablets, televisions. \$0.35 per pound charge for other electronics.

Please contact property management if you do not know where all 3 types of bins are located or did not receive a recycling guide with more details about where to put your materials.
